Currently, comics accepted across time and benefits for classrooms setting and curriculum. Based on the Statista (2016), reading was most common among those aged five to seven at 37% in 2016. Even, 67% of respondents stated that they read more comics than they used to before turned

ten. Research emerged where shows they are motivating, enrich skills and development, as well as effective for teaching and learning session for certain circumstances such as choosing appropriate and suitability of the comics resources.
